



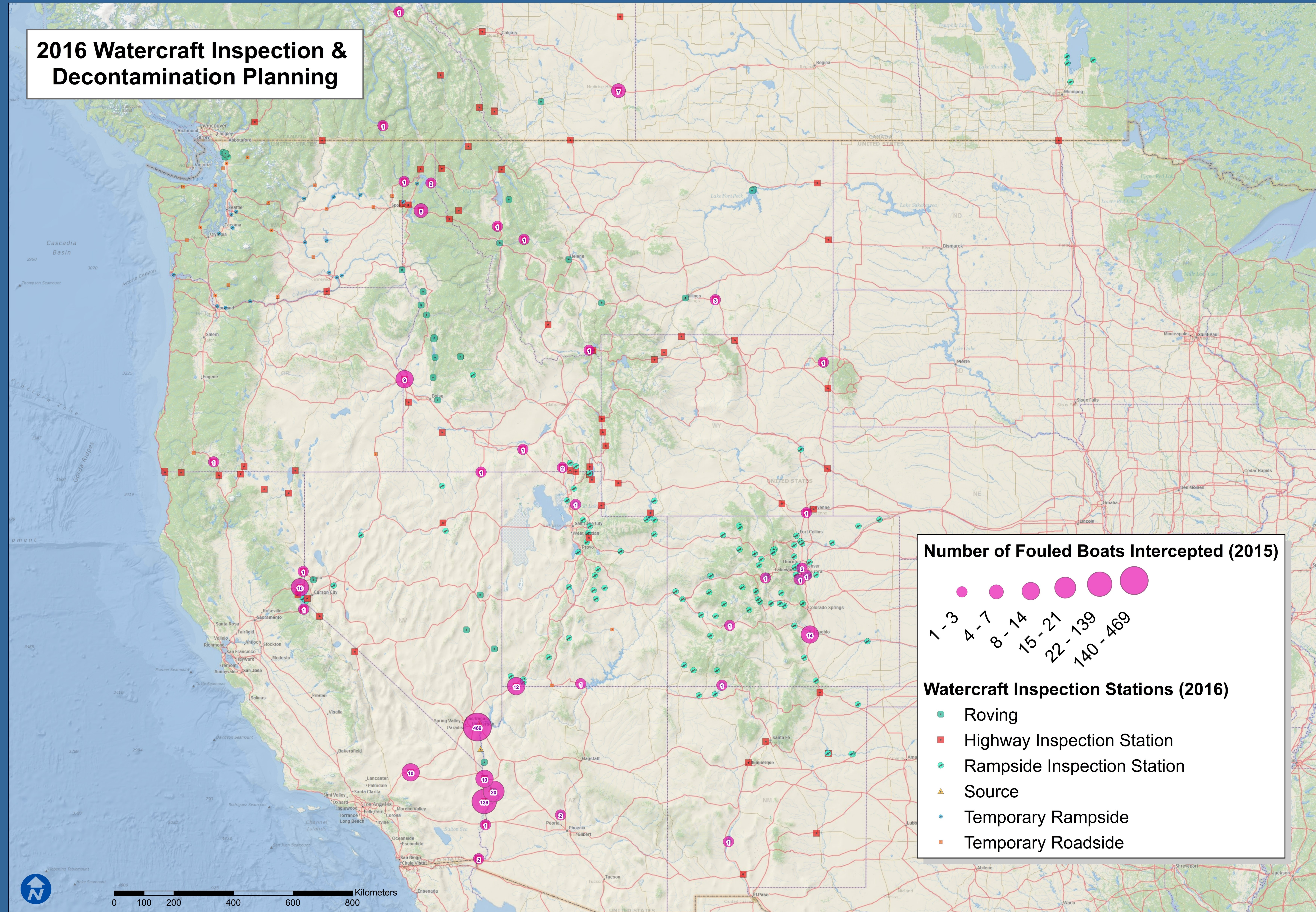
2016 Regional Watercraft Inspection Station Viewer

Advancing a Regional Defense Against Dreissenids in the Pacific Northwest
Watercraft Inspection Stations in the Western United States and Canada

Western states and Canadian provinces have been working collaboratively to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS) in the West and the introduction of quagga and zebra mussels to the Pacific Northwest through Building Consensus –A multi-state/provincial vision for watercraft inspection programs.

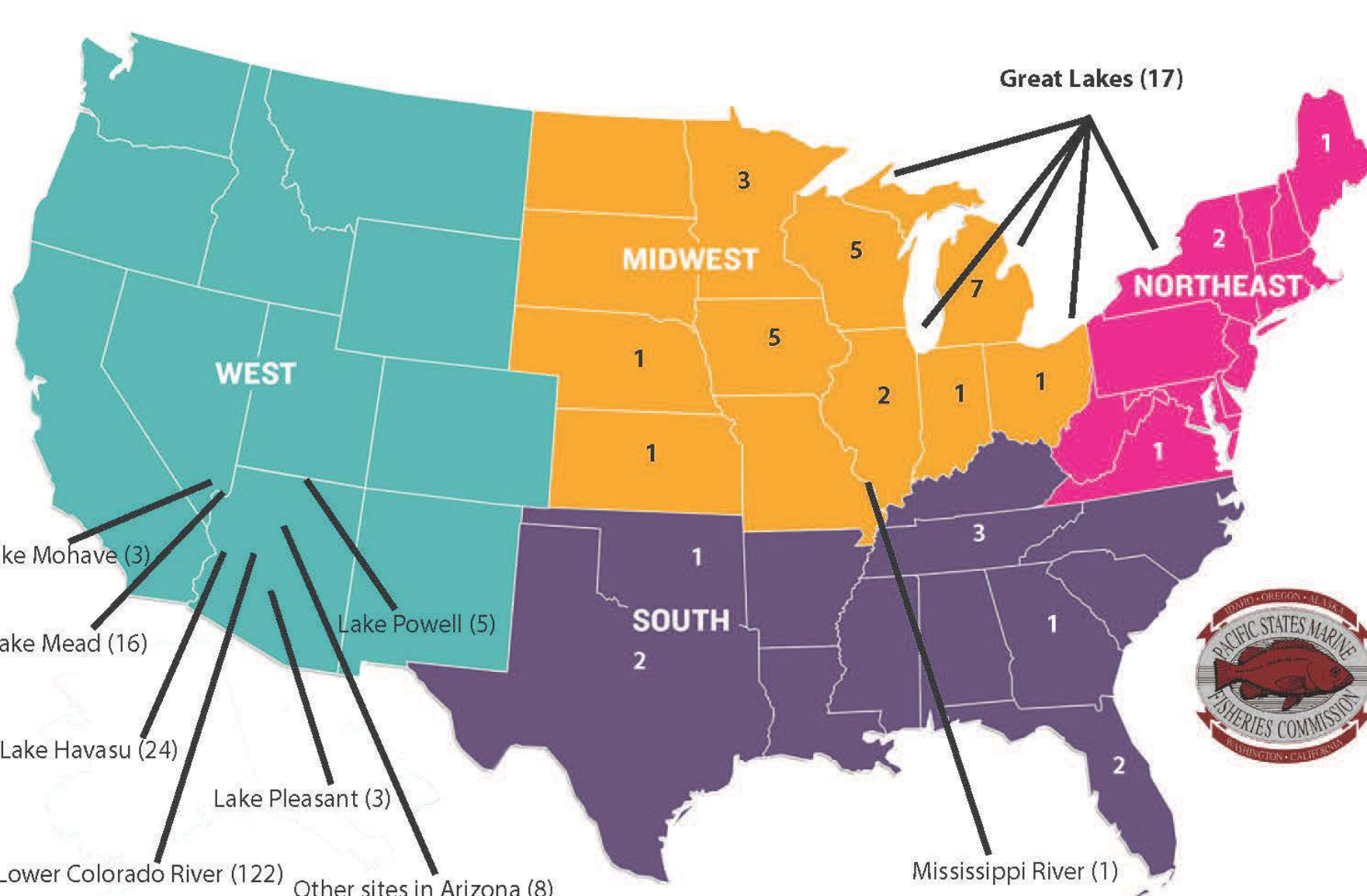
PSMFC developed and manages the Regional Watercraft Inspection & Decontamination Planning Online Viewer. Each year, AIS Coordinators share information about existing and potential locations of watercraft inspection stations, using the online viewer to make strategic decisions about the locations of the stations based on past interception location and projected needed effort.

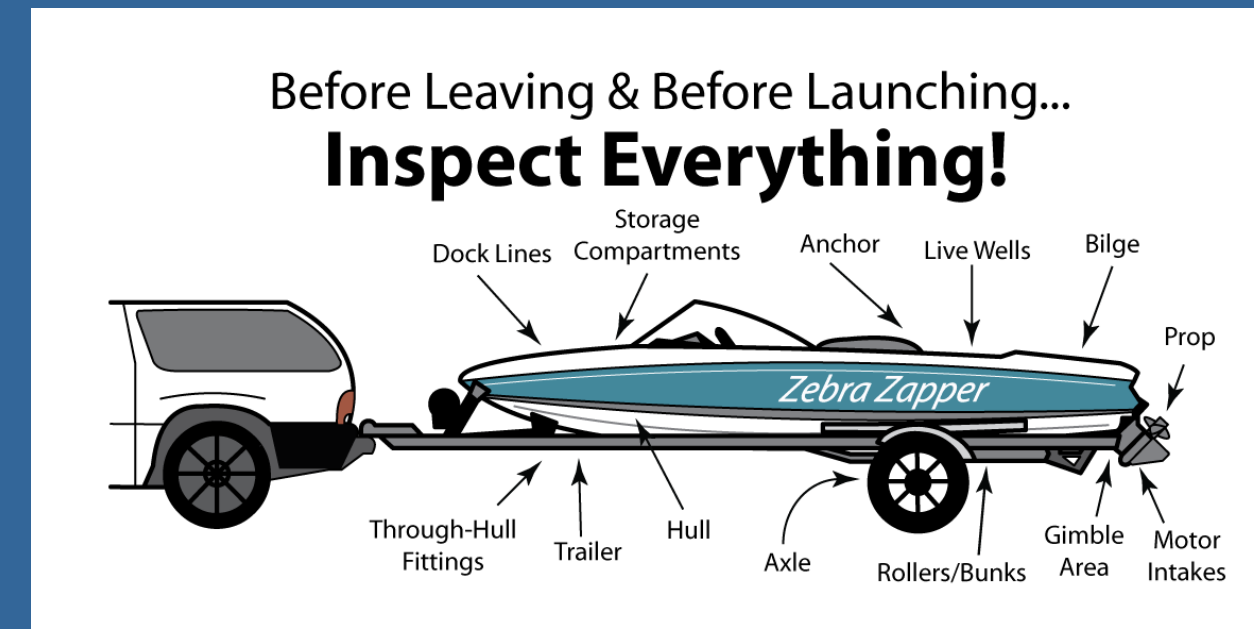
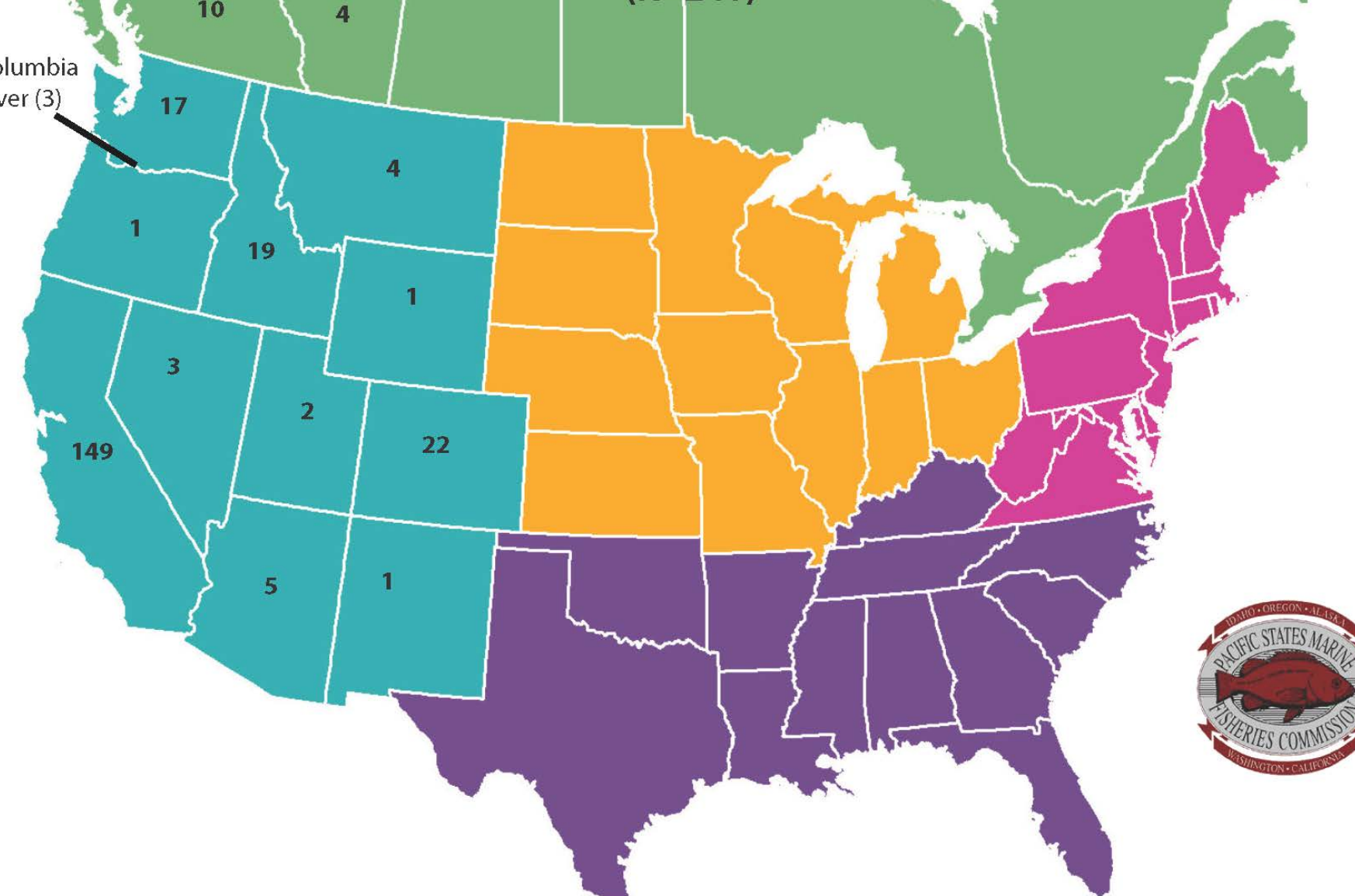


Source of Intercepted Watercraft with Adult Dreissenid Mussels in 2015 (N=248)
